



Year 7 Catch-up 2016-17

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support year 7 pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2 (KS2).

In 2016-17, we received £7,848 in catch-up funding. This funding was used to provide additional intervention booster groups, teaching assistant support and to pay for a number of teacher-led booster sessions.

Reading

Number and percentage of students on Catch-up Programme

- 11 (10%) of pupils were part of the reading catch-up programme.

Outcomes

- In September, 11 pupils were not on target in reading. By the end of the year, all but three pupils (SEN) caught up and are now at the expected standard.
- 1 pupil, who was part of the programme, left the school before the end of the year.

Maths

Number and percentage of students on Catch-up Programme

- 22 (21%) pupils were part of the maths catch-up programme

Outcomes

- In September, 16 pupils were not on target in maths. By the end of the year, 9 of the 14 pupils caught up and are now at the expected standard.
- Two of the pupils who did not catch up were SEN.
- Two pupils, who were part of the programme in maths, left before the end of the year.
