RE	Make a fact file about the one of the Christian, Islamic or Jewish faiths.	Write a paragraph about one of the faiths you are studying.	Create a glossary of at least 10 key terms of one of your topics.	Create your own religious symbol explain the faith.	Visit a place of worship e.g., Church, cathedral, mosque take pictures and write a review about it.
Computer Science	Create a glossary of key words for the topic. How: use a dictionary/ google to find the definition of each word (you may know some of them yourself!). Your glossary should be in alphabetical order and completed on lined paper.	Complete the alphabox grid with key words from the topics covered so far. Try to get at least 1 word in every box. HINT: if you are struggling to find a key word beginning with a particular letter, use a thesaurus to find an alternative!	Complete a crossword by answering the questions about programming.	Create a set of quiz questions (like the ones in Kahoot with multiple choice answers to choose from) on any topics we have covered this year. You can present it using PowerPoint, or just type out the questions and answers into Word document or Excel spreadsheet.	Create a simple game in Scratch with a score, timer and different levels. Remember to include instructions so the player knows what they have to do. Once completed, email a link to the game. (Student emails will be set up in the Autumn term)
English					Research Roald Dahl characters and create your own character using the same style. Write a paragraph to describe the character.
Maths					Put yourself into the role of a teacher in year 4. What would be 5 key skills that you would ensure your pupils could do before moving into year 5. Can you produce an information leaflet / booklet / power point presentation to inform / show your pupils?
